While holding a service in one of the dorms with our children at a South Carolina Prisons, one of the inmates face just lit up when we as a family walked into the dorm to have a service. While the children were singing, I notice that he had something on his mind to tell me. After the services in the dorms we went back to the gym to have a worship service with the men. When the men came out to the gym for the service, the man that I mention earlier walked up to me and said," Mr. Stoltzfus, today your family came to our block and ministered to us in song and testimony. As you started to minister to us, I remembered your family from three years ago when you came to the lock-up dorm where I was staying at here at Perry Correctional Institution.

There is something that I need you to know about what happen when you ministered to us in our dorm. I share this with you to encourage you in your calling. One of the men that was in the same dorm that I told you about, his name is Joe, an inmate who wore a scowl on his face and was as likely to curse at you as hit you? God gave me a heart for Joe, but no matter how I approached him there was no getting through. Then Joe's mother died.



Over the years I've seen men here close-up, disengage, and drift aimlessly downstream like a large log. Joe's scowl turned colder, more indifferent, and I feared we had lost him for good. Then one day the Amos Stoltzfus family visited our prison and came to our dorm (lock-up) sharing their hearts in song, testimony, and the Spirit of God moved throughout our dorm. The next day Joe knocked on my cell door (which he had never done before) and asked, "why did that family come? Why did those children sing?" I nearly launched into a sermon on God's call to minister to the least of these. Instead, by God's mercy, I replied, "They care, Joe. They came and sang because they cared."

Have you ever seen a stone melt? That week we saw a transformation in Joe which no scientist, psychologist, or unbeliever could explain. The last I heard Joe was leading at least two weekly Bible studies and now is as likely to cry with you as hug you."

At Leath Correctional Institution we as a family had the privilege to partner with five other volunteers from Abbeville SC. There were approximately 100+ ladies that came out for the service. The Holy Spirit visited us



and ministered to the needs of the Ladies. My wife took the opportunity to minister to the ladies by testifying the goodness of God through His word and spoke into the heart of the mothers. At the end of the service 5 ladies got born again and many others came to Christ confessing their needs to Him. Praise God for He is good, His mercy endureth forever.

Thank you all- Linda and little Sophia, Ethan, Elissa, Alayna, and mighty Isaiah- I am filled and overflowing because of your kindness. May God our Father continue to bless, anoint, and protect you and grant you sweet rest after eight weeks on tour.

Leath Chapel hosted Light of Hope Ministry with the Stoltzfus family on Wednesday July 17, 2019,. It was a night of celebration with singing and testimony of Mr. Amos Stoltzfus. In his testimony, in which he identified with us through his self-disclosure and vulnerability, he gave hope to those who saw their situations as hopeless and others also accepted the fact

that some situations can be helpless but they are not hopeless to the God of hope when we place our trust in him. Over one hundred inmates attended and clapped along to the Southern Gospel music.

Eight of the nine Stoltzfus' children were present and when their turn came to sing, it was all smiles in the audience and not many dry eyes. The youngest children sat off to the side coloring pictures which they left for us here at the institution and are now displayed in the chapel library. Within female institutions, it is important to display the value of family and parenting. We often compartmentalize our thoughts and emotions being separated from our children, forgetting often that we are still responsible and capable, even from prison, of sharing our love and the unconditional love of Jesus with them.

Having Light of Hope here reminded us that family is still an important priority and Christ can bridge the gap that these fences create. Mr. Stoltzfus and his wife spoke blessings upon all the mothers in attendance and offered the altar as a place to pray for our children and family with some of the volunteers in attendance such as Ms. Susie Fehr and Ms. Donna Wagler. Five inmates gave their life to Christ that night and all left with something they did not come in with...a smile and a future full of hope in Christ Jesus.

The New Office Building will provide a larger space that will allow us to expand and give us the ability to utilize more staff when needed. It will provide a larger storage area which is greatly needed to be able to stock up on bibles, ministry and discipleship materials for prisoners as well as office supplies.
